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Who are we? What is our mission?

IPDJ or Instituto Português do Desporto e Juventude is a governmental organization that has the task to implement in the whole national territory and at international level the youth policy. The PORTUGUESE SPORTS AND YOUTH INSTITUTE (IPDJ), results of the fusion in 2012, and succeeds in all the powers and obligations, of public bodies in the area of sport and youth, in particular the Portuguese Sport Institute, the Portuguese Youth Institute, the Foundation for the Dissemination of Information Technologies and Movijovem (Youth Hostels and Youth Card). IPDJ is widespread in the whole continental territory, with presence in the 5 regions (North, Center, Lisbon, Alentejo and Algarve) and their 18 district capitals

We have 8 areas of intervention as we develop several national programs about it – support youth organizations, citizenship and participation; health and healthy lifestyles, studies on youth; Non-formal education, social inclusion and gender quality and innovation and entrepreneurship and employment. At International level we have several youth actions. We are a member of CCIJS and we have been an active partner on International Workcamps (especially through SCI) more than 30 years till now.

Volunteers are active participants and play a crucial role in the development of the festival, supporting the organization at all levels and will directly support the organization of the festival and all that that entails. The festival is a privileged space for communication, creative fusion and cultural exchange between professionals, students and film lovers. Thus, it is intended to provide them with opportunities for personal and cultural development, as well as the acquisition of new knowledge in the field of Cinema and Audiovisuals, through their involvement, at different times, in preparing for the festival., providing these young people with organizational skills and social, which can serve as a working tool in the future.

LOGISTICAL ARRANGEMENTS

Avanca is a Portuguese parish in the municipality of Estarreja, with an area of 21.07 km² and 6 189 inhabitants. Avanca belongs to the municipality of Estarreja, District of Aveiro. It is limited by the municipalities of Murtosa, Ovar and Oliveira de Azeméis. It is served by Estrada Nacional 109, by A29, as well as by the North railway line.

The center of the workcamp takes place at the heart of the festival, at Escola Basica do Mato, where the workshops will also take place and where the secretariat and conference are located. The school is located in the center of the small village, from where the volunteers will find it easy to move between places, like supermarket, laundry, drugstore, among other services. In this same place there is a canteen with free access to volunteers.

For lunch and dinner, volunteers will go to local restaurants along with their monitors.

During the festival, lunch is provided by the school canteen.

<p>Camp Description and Aims</p> <p>This camp will take place in Baixo Vouga Lagunar, in two areas of the Estarreja municipality, both of high ecological and social value. BioRia is a network of nature trails, a paradise for birdwatching, integrated in a Natura 2000 site. In Canelas, the LUSITANICA project has been running since 2016, aiming to convert a degraded area into a model forest for nature conservation and fire prevention, as well as to rebuild heritage buildings: an abandoned water mill and a historic fountain ('Fonte dos Namoricos') which is very degraded. It is an area much cherished by the population, but it requires a major intervention to return to being the social dynamic pole it was in the past. This project integrates environmental and social interventions promoting sustainability as a whole.</p> <p>General objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Valorization and restoration of natural and cultural heritage (biodiversity, cultural heritage, watermills and fountains); - Promotion of sustainability, environmental awareness, and biodiversity protection; - Promotion of intercultural relationships, good environmental practices, and citizenship; - Promotion of intergenerational contact (some activities will have elderly people helping or explaining local traditions); - Promotion of specific skills in the field of cultural and environmental heritage protection

<p>Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ecological restoration work (control of invasive species and beneficiation of fauna and flora); - Litter gathering; cleaning walking trails; controlling invasive vegetation; - Participants will also contribute to prevent forest fires by controlling shrubs and invasive vegetation; - Build shelters and a pond for wildlife; - Vegetation trimming and removal; - Improvement of local fauna, flora, and landscape; - Improvement of a small structure used to receive groups and deliver environmental activities.

<p>What the volunteers can Learn in this Camp? (study part)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Participants will perform field tasks but also learn about nature conservation and engage in conservation-training activities, while getting to know the Portuguese fauna and flora; - Participants will also learn why nature conservation is important and how small environmental projects such as these workcamps can be crucial to preserve an entire habitat; - Encouragement of international exchange and exchange of experience; - Presentation and discussion of the natural and social reality of the regions of origin of the participants; - Promotion of environmentally and socially responsible attitudes and values; - Development of action-training actions focused on individual and collective learning; - Get to know local culture and traditions.

Canelas is also a rural area but easily accessible by train. It is also 15 minutes from Aveiro city by train.

All transportations for field work or leisure activities will be provided by the organization.

Participants will sleep in a shared sports complex in Estarreja with beds, separated by gender. The complex has a sports locker room with hot water showers also separated by gender.

The organization will provide breakfasts, lunches and dinners. Lunches and dinners are prepared/cooked by the municipality's staff and served in a canteen, but some lunches will be served in the field (sandwiches, fruit, etc.). Vegetarian/vegan meals are an option.

Internal rules of the Camp

- High sense of citizenship and environmental protection.
- Will to work for nature protection and improvement.
- Will to learn and share nature protection techniques and good practice.

Travelling from the Airport to (bus or train)

From the airport, the participants will have to go to Estarreja train station. The easiest way to get there is flying to Porto airport and take the train from there

Travelling by Bus from (Lisbon, Porto or Faro) to the Meeting point

- **From Porto airport:** Just outside the airport take the metro (subway <http://en.metrodoporto.pt/>) to '24 de Agosto main' Walk to the bus station and catch the bus to Aveiro (around 1 hour). In Aveiro take the train to Estarreja train station, urban trains in direction to Porto.
- **From Lisbon airport:** Just outside the airport take the metro (subway <http://www.metrolisboa.pt/eng/>) to Oriente main station (10 min). At Oriente, take the bus to Aveiro station (about 3h). Finally, in Aveiro, take a train to Estarreja (15min), urban trains in direction to Porto.
- **From Faro airport:** just outside the airport take the bus to the city center bus station (20 min). Catch the Bus to Aveiro (you may have to change buses along the way and the trip will take 8 to 9 hours). From Aveiro train station take the train to Estarreja train station, urban trains in direction to Porto.

Traveling by train from (Lisbon, Porto or Faro) to the Meeting Point

- **From Porto airport:** Just outside the airport take the metro (subway <http://en.metrodoporto.pt/>) to Porto – Campanhã main station (30min). At Campanhã, take the train to Estarreja station (direction Aveiro). This ride takes about 40 minutes.
- **From Lisbon airport:** Just outside the airport take the metro (subway <http://www.metrolisboa.pt/eng/>) to Oriente main station (10 min). At Oriente, take the train to Aveiro station. You can get an InterCities or an AlfaPendular train (about 2h). Finally, in Aveiro, take a train to Estarreja (15min), urban trains in direction to Porto.
- **From Faro airport:** just outside the airport take the bus to the city center (20 min), walk to the main train station in Faro and take the train to Estarreja station (you will have to make stops and change trains along the way and the trip will take around 6 hours)

Camp Description and Aims

The forest school methodology matches the concept, born in the 1950s in Scandinavia, of taking children to the countryside, to the forest. Learning in the open air in permanent contact with nature, without forgetting the individuality of each being and the importance of playing. Forest School is set in a natural environment so that children can take risks, develop positive attitudes and become confident, independent and active adults. Social, emotional and physical components are valued every day. A new movement of free education and alternative to traditional teaching wants to reconnect children to nature through emotional and fun experiences, through play. It is an inspiring process and a pedagogy that allows a permanent contact with the outside environment and works on social and emotional skills, creative thinking, communication, resilience and problem solving. A rich environment is one that offers different stimuli in nature and so we intend to prepare a space in nature to offer this possibility to a group of children between 3 and 14 years old. Through these tasks, we intend to requalify and return to the community a leisure and emotional, social and motor learning space especially dedicated to children and young people between 3 and 14 years old, for a more integral development and in connection with nature, allowing them to grow in a freer, more stimulating way and with greater respect for nature. These objectives contribute to the priorities and goals of the Europe 2020 Strategy, as they will encourage young participants to learn, develop and update skills through participation in non-formal education activities.

Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp

We want to rehabilitate some spaces in nature, with tasks such as: thinning out invasive plants, planting aromatic plants to control pests, building a natural pond to play in the water and welcome a greater diversity, making a tree climbing circuit out of natural materials (ropes, wood, cork) for children to explore, putting up safety signs and identifying flora species in a forest space, building a playground out of natural materials and in a forest context.

We are engaged in various fields since heritage, vernacular architecture and techniques, ceramics, sound, silkprint, typography, design, performance, video, new technologies applied to all of them, like 3d printers, laser cut, cnc, electronics...). we are engaged with the local community with different educational projects and activities. our facilities are divided into 4 spaces: the headquarters in the Convent of São Francisco; a ceramic research centre; a workshop for the production of handmade tiles and fired bricks and finally the raw earth laboratory where we can produce compressed earth blocks and do research for other earthen architecture techniques. Camp Description and Aims
This work camp aims to awaken youth for the traditional building techniques and the surrounding built heritage. It is an Hands-on approach in ancient building techniques, specially lime mortars and plasters, with introductions to raw earth (adobe, rammed earth, CEB, earth plasters) and ceramics (modelling, raku firing, other firing techniques). During the camp we will act in public structures repairing, maintaining and co-creating new assets on these buildings, focusing on the Castle's Kiosk and OCT's facilities (workshops where raw and fired earth materials/works are explored and produced). Cooperation, communication, self esteem, problem solving, risk evaluation, leadership and decision making are competences that we will work together while (re)building for and with the local community. We will have a detailed schedule that will be questioned and can be adapted according to the group needs.

Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp
Terra[cota] VII will provide the opportunity to build street furniture on a heritage protected area in Montemor-o-Novo. A drinking fountain will be built inside the walls of the Castle, a place with daily turistic visitors where a water point is still missing. The tasks include the building from scratch of this element and the intervention on an existing building and surrounding elements to obtain a welcoming place for visitors with space and supporting facilities in a coherent aesthetical line that still mixes traditional and innovative sustainable building solutions. A suggested program will be proposed and will be subjected to alterations according to the different wills and needs.

Note: some of the works can be repetitive and hard, it is a hands-on approach and very practical, touching the materials and tools. Knowing your limits and communicating with the monitors is essential in order to adapt the tasks to each volunteer individually. The climate can be extreme in some years, with intense sunny days reaching over 40°C, the working schedule will be flexible in order to adapt to the best working hours.

What the volunteers can Learn in this Camp? (study part)
Learning how to build in masonry technique; building arches (funicular geometry structures); glazing terracota; different finishings for terracota; apply and repair traditional lime plasters and paintings; Applying reinforced waterproof membrane on terraces; introduction to traditional handmade fired and raw earth, clay preparation and application; Repair traditional terracota brick structures (remove vegetation, cleaning and apply natural waterproof coatings like lime-wash); Cleaning and organize working areas and tools used during the activities; You will use tools like brushes, trowels, shovels, spatulas to perform tasks like painting, scratching, cleaning, mixing mortar, applying mortar, among other activities.
Opinion sharing, decision-making and feedback methods for collaborative design and implementation.

Free Time, Leisure Time and Visits preview
Ceramics - make your own clay project and take it home – from modelling to firing. Group games. Yoga. Open Air Cinema. Landscape and Heritage tour (Learning about the Montado Landscape, visiting and learning about the megalithic heritage of the region). Concerts of main national artists in the local annual fair. This activities are flexible and may adapt to the participants. Silkprint, sculpture, music, dance, electronics and new technologies are other activities that you can see around and possibly try out.

The working environment is relaxed, in the heart of a strong artistic influenced small city in Alentejo Region. Although this region has a low population density, the city can be very busy in terms of cultural activity.

Camp Description and Aims
 "TAKING CARE OF EARTH'S FUTURE" aims to promote environmental education and reflect on the issue of garbage, waste, the cycle of materials and sustainable growth. This project will have as main objective to raise awareness among participants and the local community about the importance of environmental issues, namely the practice of recycling through cleaning spaces (removing garbage improperly deposited in green spaces) and the recovery of organic material that can be composted. , transforming it into a natural fertilizer to be used in the vegetable garden or garden, thus enriching the land and reducing the amount of organic matter that is mixed with urban solid waste.

Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp
 During the Workcamp participants will perform the following tasks:

- collection of garbage and artificial waste in green spaces with collection at collection points;
- clean and prepare the 2 community composting areas;
- construction and placement of the 2 wooden composters;
- construction and placement of 2 litter bins to place bio-waste transport bags;
- elaboration and placement of 2 information panels summarizing the scope of the project, approaching the concept of community urban composting, its benefits, the waste that must be placed, etc;
- construction and placement of 2 wooden fences around the composting pens;
- development of materials for dissemination/awareness of the advantages of using community composters (posters, flyers and videos for dissemination on social networks and distribution in the community).



Camp Description and Aims

The Avecasta Cave-Settlement International Archaeological Working Camp is taken place in Central Portugal (Areias - Ferreira do Zêzere (FZ)) under the scientific coordination of the inter-disciplinary research team of the Double-u Replay Association - WR (led by José Mateus and Paula Queiroz) and the full support of the Ferreira do Zêzere Municipality. The archaeological site is unique: a vast (hall-shaped) cave, its associated karts doline (on a densely wild forested hill) which has been occupied for many centuries, mostly from the Neolithic till the dawn of the Modern Age - a unique collection of overlapping villages extraordinarily well preserved in muddy clay. The excavation is meticulous, dismounting layer by layer the ancient dwelling ground-surfaces with their domestic and artisanal structures and implies a plural scientific approach, where natural sciences, physical-chemistry (archaeometry) and geomatics (3D registration and virtualization) join the traditional archaeological disciplines

Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp

The work implies: meticulous (but technically simple) digging in clayey sand (with fine tools, such as trowels and brushes); drawing sketches (for the occurrence of the findings) on top of photographic prints of excavated soil surfaces (or as CAD-layers on digital images on tablets); collecting ancient artifacts on bags with adequate labeling and packaging (according to fragility); taking photos of the findings “in situ”; Sieving the sediments (collected in buckets) under hose water-jet (on a protected shadowed sieving installation, just outside the cave) for collecting the interesting small objects (previously unnoticed during digging); cleaning artifacts and unique identification labelling; Screening micro-fossil assemblages (seeds, charcoal, micro-mammal bones) under stereo microscopes. All participants will experience all the activities on a turn-basis schedule.

What the volunteers can Learn in this Camp? (study part)

Avecasta is a rich field-laboratory where the participants will have the opportunity to have direct contact with many diverse archaeological findings from many epochs and domains of ancient craftwork, such as ceramic shards, lithic and bone tools, metallic objects, bones (from domestic and wild macro & microfauna), as well as seeds and charcoal. They will learn about the new interdisciplinary research strategies (namely archaeometry, palynology, macropalaeobotany, micro-faunal analysis, provenance analysis, traceology) and their on-going museographic re-creative and edutainment outreach strategies.

Free Time, Leisure Time and Visits preview

The Ferreira do Zêzere region is full of beautiful sites to visit and enjoy during the daily spare time of the archaeological campaign. With the logistic support of the Ferreira do Zêzere Municipality and under the WR (hosting organization) assistance and guidance we will visit the Lago Azul (“Blue-Lake” in the margins of the vast Zêzere river dam-lake), Dornes (the old riverine medieval settlement), and the Areias village (with its renaissance old church). Music, nature exploration, speleological introductory practice will be among the extra-work activities organized and monitored by the WR experienced team.

The Avecasta cave large-hall with its high vault (like a natural cathedral, frankly open to the exterior) is a very pleasant (and beautiful) place for staying and digging in day’s journeys. The atmosphere is always fresh (but dry in Summer) and inspired by the wild beautiful and dense oak forest around, which is part of a Nature Protected NATURA 2000 site. The modern village of Avecasta, nearby, is well preserved in what concerns traditional and old rural architecture.

Participants will stay overnight in the well-equipped installations of the Scouts Centre of the town (Ferreira do Zêzere), twenty minutes (by bus) from the Avecasta cave. Breakfast and dinner will be served (around 8.00 and 19.00) in a well-equipped canteen (CRIFZ – with traditional Portuguese food but where a vegetarian choice may be previewed); Lunch (and tea-break in the afternoon) will be taken in the field (pick-nick)

Camp Description and Aims

Promote mobility and exchange through craft activities related to the Municipality of Salvaterra de Magos that encourage the exchange of experiences and knowledge of the sociocultural and artistic reality of the territory, facilitating the relationship of all young people in the community through non-formal educational activities of marked consistency in interculturality. CreArte has with the objective of establishing contacts, making friends, helping to carry out a project artisan reference and better understand Portuguese Culture and its arts/crafts. It is intended that the project will produce/reuse objects to be sold later and in this way raise funds that can help needy families, through the restoration of furniture. All of the activities will be safeguarded by hygiene, safety and health conditions at work.

Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp

This camp is organized by the Dream Dancing association. We will two partnerships with local organizations (Camara Municipal de Salvaterra de Magos, Associação de Artesões).

This camp will have activities with 3 association monitors will always be present from 9 am to 6 pm. From 18:00 to 9:00 we will only have the work camp coordinator.

Despite craftsmanship being the inspiration for this field of work and the central theme where young people will be able to experience various forms of manual work, it is in the restoration of furniture that will predominantly focus the various tasks to be developed. Young people will learn to transform monos into unique and original specimens. The challenge is to make the participants work the furniture and in this way learn in real time to give it another life. The intention is to collect a mono or rescuing an object from someone to prevent it from having a less happy end. Criarte will have two fundamental components that give rise to 2 paths to the same end:

- Restoration – return the original luster and qualities of the piece of furniture;
- Recovery – recover the furniture, transforming its appearance and structure. The approach is essentially practical, therefore, the intervention starts on the first day of work;
- There will also be a day dedicated to visiting Lisbon, the capital of Portugal, where young people will have the opportunity to get to know various tourist attractions in the region through an Uber ride through the capital;
- There will also be an afternoon dedicated to the municipality of salvaterra de magos in which a tourism technician from the City Council will accompany the group on the visit explaining the history, origin and characteristics of the municipality, always with reference to the artisanal work that Salvaterra de Magos represents so much.

– It is advisable to wear comfortable clothes and a gown or apron in order to protect her; – All participants will have to tidy their bench at the end of each class;

– They will also be responsible for cleaning and conserving all materials they use. In addition to the collection that the association will do with the community, there is a warehouse in the municipality with various furniture donated by the population and with the collaboration of artisan Rui, young people will learn to give a new life to these furniture.

– Identify, analyze and solve problems of conservation and renovation of cultural assets furniture, respecting and discussing the

MONTIS is a nature conservation NGO that operates in Portugal, founded in 2014. The main goal of MONTIS is to manage abandoned marginal land, with low or no economic value, with an ecosystem restoration approach, to recover ecosystem functionality and support increasing biodiversity. For that goal we put into practice a nature-based approach, relying on the support or restoration of the key natural processes and assets, such as soil quality, water management and habitat enhancement.

In order to get land to manage we buy land for nature conservation through crowdfunding, and we also establish management agreements with landowners.

Ecosystem restoration tasks and activities are performed mostly with volunteers. Since its foundation MONTIS has created a strong volunteering programme, with different types of volunteers. For us volunteering is an awareness-raising tool, and a way to involve people in nature conservation.

Camp Description and Aims

The work camp has the general objective of bringing together young people from different nationalities, cultures and contexts with the common objective of contributing to the increase of biodiversity, to the restoration of degraded ecosystems and the increase of the landscape's fire resilience. The conservation works will take place in an area managed by MONTIS in the interior of Portugal, in Carvalhais, São Pedro do Sul. The area where the tasks will be carried out, is an ecologically degraded and sensitive area. More info about the area can be found at <https://montisacn.com/en/managed-properties/baldio-de-carvalhais/>. It is expected that with this joint work, guided by monitors and specialized technicians, the participants will be able to develop new learnings and skills in the areas of nature and restoration of ecosystems. It is also expected, with the joint volunteering tasks, which include individual and collective tasks, fauna workshops and leisure activities, to stimulate cultural, linguistic learning and intercultural interaction amongst the community of participants. The work field is organized in a "learn by doing" logic.

As for nature outputs of the workcamp, the following are expected: to improve the conditions for the vegetation growth; improve habitats; increase fire resilience; improve soil quality; increase water infiltration into the ground; identify and record fauna and flora, which will be publicly available on the open platform iNaturalist (<https://www.inaturalist.org/projects/montis>). The ecological restoration techniques to be applied are replicable in other geographical contexts in Europe, so there is a high European added value in international participation and in the transfer of skills and learning between participants and monitors.



Voluntary Work and Tasks of the Camp

The volunteering tasks will all be directed or related to ecosystem restoration. The activities include pruning young trees with pruning shears and other cutting tools, to accelerate their growth; opening and maintenance of access paths for volunteers; construction of barriers to water runoff with local materials, to increase infiltration and improve the soil; pruning and management of pine trees, to accelerate their growth; camera trapping: consists of installing and collecting photo trapping cameras, cameras that react to movement by capturing photographs and videos of passing animals. After the work camp, MONTIS compiles all the information collected with the photo trapping cameras and sends it by email to the work camp participants; control of invasive plant species: control of the *Acacia dealbata* species, a non-native tree that occupies and degrades local ecosystems, competing with native species. Control is carried out by pulling small trees and ring barking medium and large trees, using a pocket knife; identification and registration of species of fauna and flora: this activity is guided by the monitors and supported by the use of the iNaturalist application, an application that helps to recognize species through photography. All data collected is publicly available

on the iNaturalist platform <https://www.inaturalist.org/projects/montis>.

What the volunteers can Learn in this Camp? (study part)

Ecosystem restoration techniques and approaches. Techniques to: restore riparian vegetation; improve soil quality and reduce water runoff; accelerate the growth of native trees; control invasive plant species. Learn about the effects and use of prescribed fire for ecosystem restoration. Volunteers will learn to work with camera trapping, and also with tools to identify and register fauna and flora. Volunteers will learn about animal species (bats and/or amphibians) and invasive plant species in workshops dedicated to these themes.

Free Time, Leisure Time and Visits preview

Free and leisure time will be spent in the surroundings of Bioparque de Carvalhais (<https://bioparque.org>). Activities like nature walking trails, slide, observation of nature, swimming pool and outdoor activities are available for the volunteer's free time. MONTIS will organise a bat workshop, an invasive species workshop, a natural engineering workshop and visits to the local natural and cultural values of the area (watermills, heritage "Castro's", streams and oaklands).

The location of the workcamp is in a remote rural area, with almost no population. Volunteers will camp in bioparque de Carvalhais (<https://bioparque.org>). The closest village is 2 km from the camping. MONTIS will have a van available to support the needed transportation. The intervention area distances from the campsite about 20 minutes walking. The van will be used to transport volunteers when needed, but walking is the main transportation. MONTIS will transport all tools, water and food needed for the volunteering period to the volunteering site. Camping site coordinates: 40°47'51.4"N 8°07'43.8"W. Working site coordinates: 40°48'17.0"N 8°07'46.5"W.

Volunteers will be camping. There is a central facility with showers, and WC for women and man, with all basic hygiene facilities. There is another central facility for socializing, with board and card games, and a small bar/shop. The camping site has internet available, as well as outdoors barbecue and eating tables. There is no kitchen or laundry.

MONTIS will provide regular meals, with the possibility of vegetarian by request. These include breakfast, lunch, afternoon snack and dinner. Lunch will be served on the field as packed lunch. If volunteers have dietary restrictions of any kind, these restrictions must be communicated to MONTIS for proper preparations.


